FEEL THE HEAT FOR OHIO PUBLIC OFFICIALS

"Feel the Heat" provides an opportunity for public officials to learn first-hand about the challenges firefighters face on a daily basis. Ohio FireAcademy instructors work closely with public officials as they learn new skills and gain a better understanding of what it means to be a firefighter.

With your local fire chief as your sponsor, you will have an opportunity to participate in this orientation program. Classroom instruction will be combined with hands-on, realistic situations. For example, you will wear turn-out gear and use self-contained breathing apparatus to conduct search-andrescue operations in a darkened maze. You will learn about and use a variety of hose techniques and put into practice your new skills in a live burn in the Burn Building.

HOW TO PARTICIPATE

Contact your local fire chief to register for this year's **Feel the Heat** event to be held Nov. 3, 2018 at the Ohio Fire Academy.

WHAT TO BRING

- A fire representative from your area
- Turnout gear, boots, gloves, helmet and liner.*
 Casual clothing should be worn under turnout gear. You may want to bring clean clothes to wear when the day's activities are done.
- Self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA).*
- Please note: If you have a beard, you will not be able to take part in some of the day's activities.
 - *Your fire chief will be able to help you arrange for this equipment.
